**Refund for Withdrawal**  
**Spring 2010**

As of the first day of classes, students who wish to drop **ALL** courses for which they are registered must withdraw from the university to avoid academic or financial responsibility. Check the important links on the [Withdrawing from UNC Charlotte](#) website to be sure that you have completed all of the appropriate notifications.

Students awarded Federal financial aid will also be subject to the Return of Title IV Funds Policy. This may result in a balance due on your tuition and fees bill. Federal Title IV aid includes Stafford Loans, Perkins Loans, PLUS Loans, Pell Grants, SEOG Grants, ACG Grants, and SMART Grants. Tuition and fee refunds for Official Withdrawals are prorated based on the schedule below. Students who completely withdraw from the University by these dates are due a refund/reduction as follows:

<b>Withdrawal Date</b>	<b>Refund %</b>
1/10/10	100% of tuition and fees
1/11 – 1/16/10	100% of tuition and fees with a \$25 withdrawal fee
1/17 – 1/21/10	100% of tuition and fees with a \$75 withdrawal fee
1/22 - 1/30/10	80% of tuition and fees
1/31 - 2/6/10	75% of tuition and fees
2/7 - 2/13/10	70% of tuition and fees
2/14 - 2/20/10	60% of tuition and fees
2/21 - 2/27/10	55% of tuition and fees
2/28 - 3/6/10	50% of tuition and fees
3/7 - 3/13/10	40% of tuition and fees
